



Bill Harroff joined the Supermen of America in 1958 and has done his best to pursue Truth, Justice and the American Way ever since. He was presented the 1st Marvelmaniac of the Month award in 1969 by Mark Evanier and a coveted No-Prize by Stan Lee soon after. He has taught manga at Technos University in Tokyo; illustration at Oskar Kokoschka's School of Vision in Salzburg; and has lectured on creating comics around the world. He has studied with leading illustrators such as Germany's Luis Murschetz, as well as current comic greats, Christopher Moeller, Scott McCloud and Matt Kindt.

William Harroff has received a National Endowment for the Arts fellowship, an NEA Regional Artists' Project grant, the Frank B. Sessa Scholarship, the Governor's International Exchange Program Grant, a Ragdale Foundation residency and top honors in several international art competitions. He holds degrees with Highest Distinction from Purdue University, Indiana University and the ISBK. His bookworks are in the collections of the Victoria & Albert Museum, the Museum of Modern Art, the Museum of Contemporary Art and the New York Public Library, among many others.
